CHAPTER ONE: Humble Beginnings - Wang Chuanfu's Vision

Every global giant begins somewhere, often with an idea, a relentless spirit, and a touch of serendipity. For BYD, that genesis can be traced back to the burgeoning economic landscape of 1990s China and the singular vision of a young chemist named Wang Chuanfu. Born in 1966 in Wuwei County, Anhui Province, a time when China was still navigating its complex path towards modernization, Wang's early life was marked by hardship and the resilience it fosters.
