It was during a reward trip following this course that the hand of fate intervened. The trip, a journey to the larger Brazilian cities of Curitiba, São Paulo, and Rio de Janeiro, was a celebratory outing, a chance for the girls to experience a world beyond Horizontina.

It was in a shopping center in Curitiba that the trajectory of Gisele's life took an irreversible turn. An agent from Elite Model Management, a global powerhouse in the modeling industry, spotted her. In a moment that has become the stuff of legend, the agent recognized raw, untapped potential in the tall, gangly teenager. Following her unexpected discovery, Gisele participated in the Elite Model Look contest, then known as Look of the Year.
