CHAPTER ONE: Early Life and Family Roots

Stefani Joanne Angelina Germanotta, who would later become known globally as Lady Gaga, was born on March 28, 1986, in the bustling heart of New York City. Her arrival at Lenox Hill Hospital in Manhattan marked the beginning of a life destined for extraordinary artistic expression and profound influence. Stefani was raised in an upper-middle-class Catholic household on the Upper West Side of Manhattan. Both her parents, Joseph Germanotta, an internet entrepreneur, and Cynthia Louise (née Bissett), a philanthropist and business executive, hail from Italian ancestry. From a very young age, Stefani displayed a remarkable affinity for music. Her mother, Cynthia, encouraged this budding talent, wanting her to become a "cultured young woman." At the tender age of four, Stefani began playing the piano. While she took piano lessons, she had a natural inclination to learn music by ear, preferring to interpret sounds she heard in her head rather than relying solely on sheet music. This innate musicality was evident early on; by age five, she had already composed her first song, titled "Dollar Bills," reportedly inspired by Pink Floyd's "Money."

The Germanotta family fostered an environment where artistic pursuits were supported. Stefani's paternal grandparents purchased the piano she learned on for \$780 in 1966, eventually passing it down to her parents. This instrument would later be featured in the "Women Who Rock" exhibition at the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and Museum. Cynthia Germanotta recalled that Stefani, even as a baby, would gravitate towards the piano, pulling herself up by its leg and pressing the keys to hear the sounds.

At the age of 11, Stefani Germanotta enrolled at the Convent of the Sacred Heart, a private all-girls Roman Catholic school in Manhattan. This prestigious institution, New York City's oldest private school for girls, has a notable list of alumni, including members of the Kennedy family and Nicky Hilton Rothschild. Stefani described herself

during her high school years as "very dedicated, very studious, very disciplined." Despite her diligent nature, she also admitted to feeling "a bit insecure," sometimes perceiving herself as a misfit and facing teasing for being "too provocative or too eccentric." The student body at Sacred Heart was diverse, ranging from those with immense wealth to others on welfare or scholarships, with Stefani's family falling somewhere in the middle. This environment led her to take on a job as a diner waitress, using her earnings to purchase designer items, like a Gucci handbag, to fit in with her more affluent classmates.

While attending the Convent of the Sacred Heart, Stefani continued to hone her musical abilities. She practiced piano daily, participated in school plays, and was part of bands. By the age of 13, she had written her first piano ballad. The following year, at just 14, she began performing at open mic nights in New York City clubs, taking her first steps onto the public stage. This early exposure to performing in various venues laid crucial groundwork for her future career. Her time at Sacred Heart even inspired a future project: years later, in 2011, she filmed her Thanksgiving television special, *A Very Gaga Thanksgiving*, at the school, where she performed songs and discussed her life and inspirations.
